Placement Rates within one month of Graduation

At the undergraduate level, increases in placement may be tied to increases in participation in internships and co-op positions which can be tied to the Passport to Success program requirement which was instituted in Fall 2012.

DSB students tend to have many responsibilities outside of school. In 2015 and 2016, 30% of undergraduate students reported working full time, while 60% reported working part time.
