The Summit Scholars Program is a bold and innovative initiative that provides students with a rigorous and personalized education, intensified by exceptional leadership and service opportunities.

Summit Scholars are highly accomplished. They are tomorrow's composers, engineers, philanthropists, business leaders, attorneys, politicians, and educators.

Exceptional Purdue University Fort Wayne freshman applicants are invited to compete for the university's most prestigious full-ride awards: the Chapman and Doermer Distinguished Scholarships.

These competitive, merit-based scholarships—available to current high school seniors—offer full tuition, housing, textbooks, a stipend for food, and fees paid for up to four years.

All Summit Scholarships are awarded based on a holistic review of applicant information and competition performance.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- » Current high school senior set to complete Core 40 Diploma requirements or other college-prep curriculum
- » Cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher and 1380 SAT or 29 ACT; or 1470 SAT or 32 ACT with no consideration of GPA
- » Submission of a completed application to Purdue Fort Wayne by December 1
- » Completion of the FAFSA (school code 001828) by December 1
- » Participation in the Virtual Summit Scholars Competition on February 13

RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS

- » Be enrolled full-time during the fall and spring semesters (summer enrollment is optional)
- » Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher
- » Meet program expectations
- » Reside in on-campus housing

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Summit Scholars Program administers two full-ride scholarships: the Chapman Scholarship and the Doermer Distinguished Scholarship. Both awards offer full tuition, housing, textbooks, a stipend for food, and fees paid for up to four years. Everyone who competes at the Summit Scholars Competition is eligible for the Chapman Scholarship. Depending on your major, you may be eligible to compete for the Doermer Distinguished Scholarship as well.

COMPETITION



Can I compete in the Purdue Fort Wayne Virtual Summit Scholars Competition?

Yes, if you're graduating from high school in 2021. To be eligible to compete in the competition, you must meet the academic requirements and submit a complete application to Purdue Fort Wayne by December 1. After a holistic review of all applicants is complete, those selected to compete will be invited to participate.

How do I apply for the Purdue Fort Wayne Virtual Summit Scholars Competition?

Once you apply to Purdue Fort Wayne and are deemed eligible to compete, the competition coordinator will send you the direct link to apply via email and mail.

When is the virtual competition?

The competition will be on Saturday, February 13, 2021.

What will I be doing at the virtual competition?

You will take part in an interview, engage in one-on-one meetings with delegates from your declared major, and attend an information fair.

What should I wear?

Business casual or business formal attire is recommended.

How will I be notified if I'm selected?

Once the competition results are finalized, the six Chapman Scholars and one Doermer Distinguished Scholar will be selected and offered scholarships. If you are offered a scholarship, you'll need to reply to the Summit Scholars Program by the deadline listed with your offer.

- » Apply to Purdue Fort Wayne by **December 1** (application must be complete).
- » Submit your FAFSA (school code 001828) by **December 1** as a part of your qualification to compete.
- » Complete the Summit Scholarship online application, which includes two essays, by **January 15**. The application is a key component in the selection process.
