The Getting to Graduation Roadmap program is design to encourage our underrepresented students to take advantage of campus services and events that will enrich their academic experience and connect them to the university. The Roadmap awards students points for participation in campus activities, events and programs.

As a participant in the G2G program, I understand that each type of activity is worth 25 points, for a minimum of 300 pts (100 pts in each category) by the end of the academic year. A small gift will be awarded to students completing a minimum of 150 pts by the end of the fall semester. At the end of the spring semester G2G students will be invited to participate in the Multicultural Graduation celebration, where they will be recognized for their participation in the program. Students completing a total of 300 pts will also receive a G2G gift. Graduating students who register for the celebration will received a Graduation scroll that they can wear at their commencement ceremony. Students may join the program at any time in the semester and all class standing are welcomed.

The Getting to Graduation program is designed to encourage our underrepresented students to take advantage of campus services and events that will enrich their academic experience and connect them to the university. The Getting to Graduation program uses a Graduation Roadmap that awards points to students for participation in a variety of campus activities, events and programs.

How it works:

- Student will earn points in three areas of activities, Social, Academic and Career. For a total of 300 pts. At the end of each semester, students earning at least half of the required points (150 pts) will earn a small Getting to Graduation gift. At the end of each academic year student earning the total points will be awarded a bonus gift especially designed for each part of their journey.
- At the end of the Spring semester all graduating International and Underrepresented students will be invited to attend the Multicultural Graduation Celebration. Graduating students who register for the event will be given a graduation scroll that they can wear at their PFW/ IFW Commencement ceremony. Students who participate in the Getting to Graduation Program and earn 300 points for the academic year will be recognized at the graduation celebration.
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To receive points, students must download and fill out the “Getting to Graduation Activity Sheet” and either email it to g2g@pfw.edu , turn in a printed copy to the Office of Diversity and Multicultural Affairs or scan and complete the form on the QR Code below.





Academic activities can include things like:

- Using Tutoring Services (minimum of 5 times)
- Meeting with your academic Advisor/enroll in your spring classes
- Applying for your Financial Aid by the early deadline
- Attending College 101 or Academic Workshops
- Earning/Maintaining a G.P.A of 2.5 for Undergraduates / 3.0 for Graduate students

Social Activities can include things like:

- Attending at least 4 ODMA/TRIO/TWC/TQC, etc. events
- Introducing yourself to the ODMA staff
- Attending a Campus Sporting Event
- Attending a Campus sponsored Art or Music Event
- Attending a SAB/Student Life activity

Career/Major Activities can include things like:

- Participating in a campus job/or work-study
- Attending a Student Leadership Retreat
- Attending an Internship Fair
- Visiting the Career Development Center for a career related help
- Attending a Departmental club or org.
