Human Resources offers employees the opportunity to optimize their personal and professional achievement through the Supervise for Success training program. The program consists of ten* learning units and is designed to equip employees with tools, techniques and information essential to successful performance. Upon completion*, participants receive a certificate acknowledging their accomplishment.

A collaborative effort between Human Resources and other campus resources, learning units include:

- Foundations for Success: Core Behaviors and Competencies: Learn what core behaviors and competencies lead to employee success, and gain insight into fundamental employment laws.
- **Key University Policies & Employment Laws:** Understand how the decisions you make impact key employment laws and university policies. *(Consists of two learning units.)*
- **Myers-Briggs: Building Collaborative Relationships:** Discover how each persons' uniqueness contributes to the workplace. (*Participants will complete on-line Myers-Briggs Type Indicator.*)
- **Hiring Talented Individuals:** Learn more about the recruitment process and gain important skills for selecting employees.
- **Managing Conflict:** Learn more about your style of handling conflict and discover other styles that will increase your effectiveness.
- **Communication Skills for Supervisors:** Discover how to become a more effective communicator, listener, and how to give effective feedback.
- **Managing Performance:** Gain an understanding of the performance management process, your role in the process, and techniques for conducting an effective performance discussion.
- Strategic Leadership: Identifying Your Leadership Strategy: Discover various leadership strategies and understand how your behavior impacts the performance of your team.
- **Managing Diversity:** Gain an understanding of the value of diversity and the positive aspects of diverse cultures, behaviors, viewpoints, and experiences.
