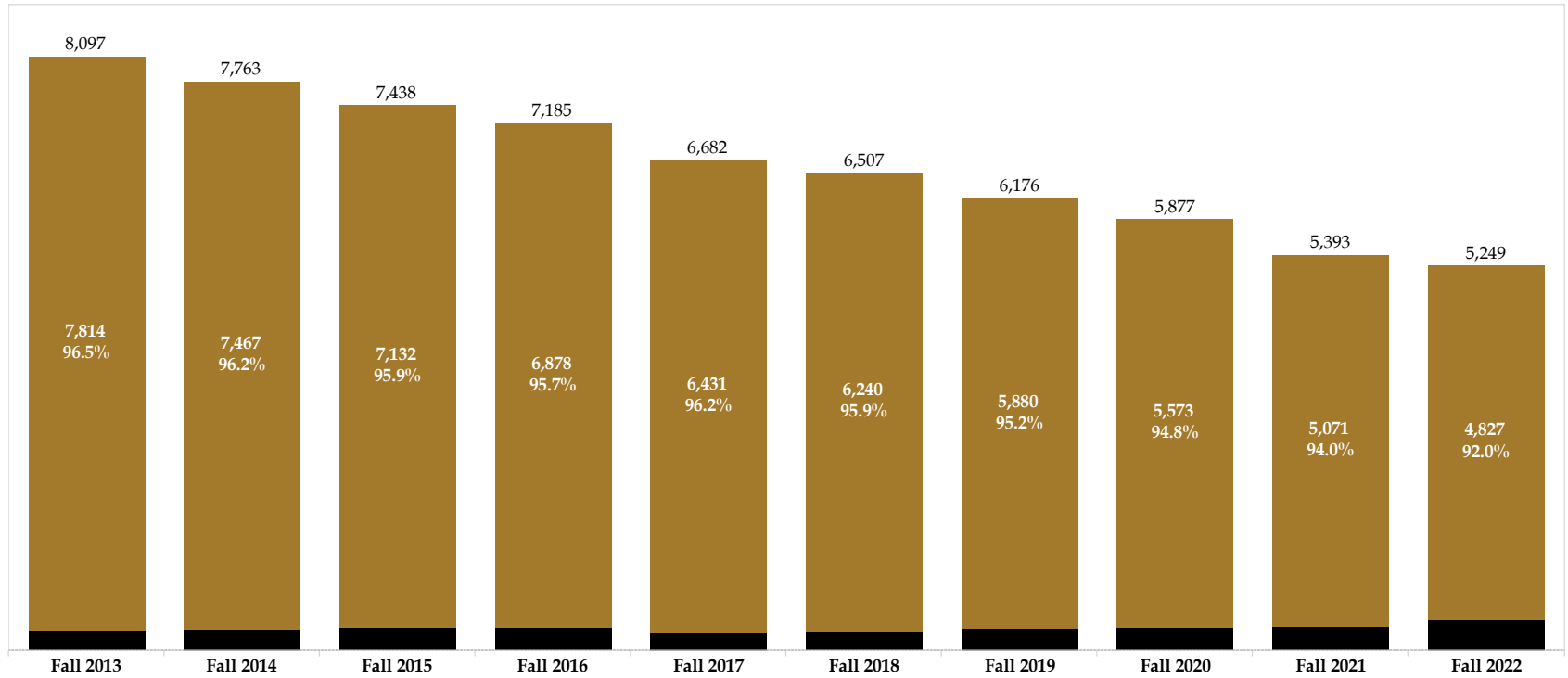

Notes:

- a. Student enrollment is counted if a student is registered for at least one course on the census snapshot date for each fall semester. Student enrollment includes all degree-seeking and non-degree seeking students.
- b. Academic categorization of undergraduate or graduate students is based on a student's primary academic program of study. The Graduate Level encompasses Masters, Doctor of Nursing Practice, and Graduate Certificates. The Undergraduate Level encompasses Associates, Baccalaureates, and Undergraduate Certificates. Non-degree seeking students are identified at both the Undergraduate and Graduate levels.
- c. Student FTE is the number of credit enrolled relative to a full or normal load in a semester. The full-time load is 15 hours for undergraduates and 12 hours for graduate students. FTE is calculated by summing total enrolled credit hours divided by 15 for undergraduate and 12 for graduate students. FTE allows PFW to compare instruction hours, regardless of the number of students enrolled.
