- Activate your myIPFW account** and student email with the “Get Me Started” button on the my.ipfw.edu login page. Don't forget to jot down your university email account, as it will serve as the primary means of communication with the institution.
- Processing of I-20.** If you haven't already, please email a copy of your passport and [certification of financial support](#) to [iss@ipfw.edu](mailto:iss@ipfw.edu) so we can issue you the Form I-20.
- Confirm your enrollment** with the online Intent to Enroll form sent to you from the International Admissions office. By informing us of your intentions we will be able to follow up with you regarding what's next in your preparation for your arrival at IPFW.
- Submit your arrival information** using the online form sent to you from the Office of International Education.
- Register for classes.** Advising and Registration will occur during International Student Orientation.
- Make sure you pay your fees through myIPFW after you receive your first bill.**
- Celebrate your achievements!** You've earned it.

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## Placement Tests

### Find your starting point.

As a new IPFW student, you must take the English and math placement tests as part of your enrollment process once you arrive on campus. The Office of International Education will make this appointment for you and it will take place during International New Student Orientation.

Your assigned advisor will use your results to help you plan courses for your first semester during your Advising and Registration appointment during orientation.

If you have a foreign language requirement for your major and you completed two years of foreign language classes in high school, you must take a foreign language placement test prior to registration.
