## **Scholarship General Information**

- 1. All scholarships are limited in number. Scholarship monies will cover half the amount of the published fee in the Community Arts Academy brochure. Families are eligible for one scholarship per term.
- 2. Student/family must be a recipient of free/reduced-price meals and/or books in his/her local school system or a recipient of a government sponsored nutritional program such as Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).
  - a. Verification of student affiliation in these programs is required. Molly Papier, director of the Community Arts Academy can help with this.
  - b. If student is part of the free/reduced lunch/books program, please provide copy of proof with registration form by sending a copy of the **current** letter.
  - c. If the family is a recipient of SNAP, please provide a copy of your benefits card.

## **Guidelines for Scholarship**

- 1. Student must be entering kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade in the current school year.
- 2. Student must be in good academic standing with their school.
- 3. 100% attendance is expected at each class session. Failure to attend may effect future assistance.
- 4. Student and parent/guardian must fill out a Request for Scholarship Assistance form.
- 5. Participants will be contacted by phone, email or letter if they have been accepted for a scholarship.
- 6. All "balance due" fees must be paid in full at least two (2) weeks prior to the start of the class.
- 7. Once all fees have been paid, an acceptance letter, email or phone call will go to the participant with relevant class information.
