For diehard fans of the Purdue Fort Wayne men's basketball team who were at Gates Sports Center on Sunday, it was Damian Chong Qui's 3-pointer launched from just inside the center court line that gave all involved a chance to celebrate in a way most folks only dream about. The shot earned the Dons a 77-75 win over Wright State, and Chong Qui a place in PFW Athletics history. The fifth-year senior finished the Senior Day contest with 16 points. Jarred Godfrey, PFW's recently-minted all-time leading scorer, added 25 points, five rebounds, and six steals.

OSU Women's Gender and Sexuality Studies Professor to Present Lecture about the Relationship between the Trump Presidency and LGBTI Human Rights



Cynthia Burack, professor of women's, gender, and sexuality studies at Ohio State University, will present the 2023 College of Liberal Arts Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Lecture Thursday at 5:30 p.m. Burack's presentation will take place in the International Ballroom at Walb Student Union and is open to faculty, staff, students, and the public.

The talk, entitled "How Trump and the Christian Right Saved LGBTI Human Rights: A Religious Freedom Mystery," will analyze the surprising results of the Christian right's support of Donald Trump and its demands that the U.S. end support for sexual orientation and gender identity human rights in its foreign policy.

Burack will also facilitate a discussion for PFW faculty on Friday at 9:30 a.m. in the Steel Dynamics Keith E. Busse Mastodon Alumni Center. As part of the conversation, faculty will have the opportunity to talk with Burack about how anti-LGBTQ politics and the efforts to dismantle cultural studies are impacting classroom practices, among other topics. Interested faculty are encouraged to provide topics and questions ahead of time, as well.


