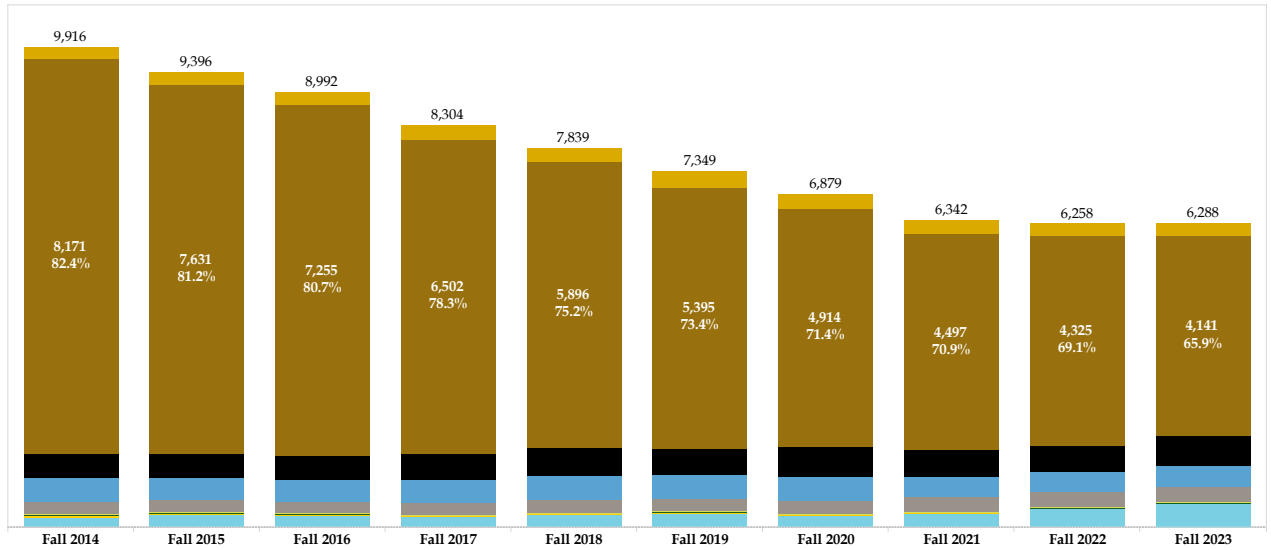

Notes:

- a. Student enrollment is counted if a student is registered for at least one course on the census snapshot date for each fall semester. Student enrollment includes degree-seeking and non-degree-seeking undergraduate and graduate students.
- b. Purdue Fort Wayne ethnicity data is collected in accordance with categories developed in 1997 by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) that are used to describe groups to which individuals belong, identify with, or belong in the eyes of the community. The categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. The designations are used to categorize U.S. citizens, resident aliens, and other eligible non-citizens.
 - First, individuals are asked to designate ethnicity as; Hispanic or Latino or Not Hispanic or Latino
 - Second, individuals are asked to indicate all races that apply among the following: American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African-American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, or White.
