The following are the recommendations of the Budgetary Affairs

Subcommittee (BAS) for the 1997-1998 budgetary year.

- All new initiatives involving the commitment of significant
- recurring funds (suggested level \$50,000) should be presented,
- early in the formative stages, to the BAS for analysis of financial
- impact.
- •
- Funding for the Library should continue to remain a very high
- priority.
- •
- Efforts should be continued to reduce the high dependence
- on associate faculty, in favor of full-time tenure track positions.
- •
- All major campus-wide new or continuing student recruitment/retention
- activity should be accompanied by a cost/benefit analysis.
- •
- Until IPFW achieves at least an average ranking, in terms
- of state support per student, compared to other state-supported
- institutions, all IPFW administrators, faculty, and staff should
- be persistent in their efforts to remedy this deficiency. The

- funding status report (similar to Senate Document 96-7) should
- be updated annually by the administration and disseminated widely.

•

- In light of the analysis done for item 5 that shows, by several
- different sources, that IPFW faculty salaries are significantly
- below the salaries at the other similar Indiana institutions,
- faculty/staff salary increases should remain the highest priority
- and the amount of increase should be at least the amount allocated
- by the state for that purpose. Furthermore, funds for increasing
- faculty/staff salaries should not be used for any purpose other
- than to increase current faculty/staff salaries.

•

- No IPFW moneys should be used for any life cycle cost of the
- McKay farm development.

•

- There should be no increase in the number of positions or
- level of funding for administrative positions.

•

- Extend the use of the technology fee for computer related
- areas from hardware related items to include software (tied to
- classroom instruction), teaching assistants for the laboratories,
- 800 phone line access and additional dial-up and Internet access,
- and general supplies for student output.
