MINIMUM DRIVER QUALIFICATIONS-Students and Volunteers

- 1. Possess a valid US or Canadian driver's license with a classification appropriate to the type of Vehicle being driven, or a valid license from another country where a Vehicle is being operated.
- 2. Be at least 18 years of age and have one year of licensed driving experience prior to driving on University Business. Requests for exceptions to these requirements must be submitted to Risk Management in advance for review on a case-by-case basis.
- Be at least 20 years of age, have at least 2 years of licensed driving experience, and complete the
 passenger van training program prior to operating a van on University Business. Passenger van
 training must be completed annually.

- 4. Have an "acceptable" driving record, as defined by Risk Management above. Individuals who are unsure of their driving record may secure a copy of their MVR from their auto insurance provider or through the Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles.
