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6. Health Insurance Debate

- A Representative from Faculty Senate approached APSAC about joining with them regarding issues with the health benefits. Discussion followed about how we want to proceed: do we want to join with them?
 Has CSSAC been asked? If not, why was only APSAC approached?
- Many on campus have expressed worry about the changes to the health plans being offered. The
 Traditional Plan served many employees with chronic health issues, and it's being eliminated in 2021
 and replaced with a higher deductible HSA. There are many concerns about out-of-pocket costs without
 the traditional plan.
- HR is presenting forums for more information about enrollment and the new plan. We need to encourage attendance.

7. HR Updates: Melissa

- HR is sending more emails—at least weekly now—in an attempt to be more proactive. This also means they are less likely to roll things back because more people should be informed.
- There are weekly sessions planned, up to open enrollment, regarding the new health plans. The benefit guide is online this year (no printed copies). There is an extra weekend planned for people to get enrolled. There will also be walk-in sessions in a computer lab during open enrollment to assist employees with the enrollment process.
- Dimples has sent out an email on goal-setting in Success Factors. Everyone must have goals in place before October 4. And incomplete goals from last year can be moved to this year. The goals link in SuccessFactors is different than the one in Dimples's email. Melissa will check with Dimples to find out what the differences are.
- There should now be Career Paths showing in SuccessFactors that give salary information (handout circulated). However, APSAC members have found there is still a lack of clarity in what jobs are in what pay band. Melissa recommended anyone with questions or concerns to contact the HR reps for more information.
