The Wait for Commencement Is Almost Over: Graduating Students Reflect on Their Time at Purdue Fort Wayne



PFW Adds Valuable Career and Salary Data to Its Popular Academic Program Finder

The **program finder** section of the Purdue University Fort Wayne website is its most visited section. It's where prospective and current students can go to learn more about PFW's majors and minors. To enhance this already important tool, supplemental career data, including related job titles and projected salary data for Fort Wayne and the nation, has been added to all 200+ listings.

"We're really pleased to be able to add this real-time, real-world data to the academic program finder," says Jerry Lewis, vice chancellor for communications and marketing. "This puts one more powerful tool into the hands of students and families who are making critical decisions that will affect the trajectory of their education and careers."

While general labor market and salary data may not represent the outcomes experienced by all PFW graduates in these programs, the added information can be indispensable during the decision-making process. Salary and employment outcomes vary by geographic area, work experience, education, and opportunities for employment that are outside the university's control.



Campus Community Invited to Help 'Top Out' Surack-Sweetwater Music Industry Building Tomorrow

The tradition of topping out a new construction with its last—and often highest—beam will be observed Thursday at 3:30 p.m. at the site of the Surack-Sweetwater Music Industry Building on the campus of Purdue University Fort Wayne.


Leading up to this milestone, students, faculty, and staff are also invited to help leave their mark on the project by signing the freshly painted piece of steel up until noon on Thursday. The beam is currently located on the southeast corner of the construction site along Mastodon Way. Those wishing to take advantage of this opportunity are encouraged to bring their own Sharpies.

After the beam is hoisted into place Thursday afternoon, it will be adorned with an American flag.

Several representatives of the university, its College of Visual and Performing Arts, and Weigand Construction will be on hand to observe the topping out and share additional information. Interviews will also be available, upon request.

A ceremonial groundbreaking for the university's \$25 million, 26,000-square-foot facility that's scheduled to open in time for the fall 2026 semester took place in September. Its name recognizes and honors the crucial support Chuck and Lisa Surack have provided to the project, and to acknowledge their essential role in the PFW School of Music's growth since it welcomed its first students nearly seven years ago.

Behind-the-Scenes Coliseum Tour Previews Days and Nights on the Job for Music Industry Students

Of the tidbits learned during a recent Memorial Coliseum visit, two incredulous items stood out for students from Jason Lundgren's concert and events production class. A comedian wanted only orange M&Ms for his dressing room, and a rock musician asked for a dozen tube socks.

"I think they put a lot of that stuff in the requests just to make sure we are reading it," said Nathan Dennison, the Coliseum's vice president of sales.

That might have been behind the M&Ms, but the tube socks were a real need because of the musician's sweaty feet, and he used all 12 pairs by the end of his appearance in Fort Wayne.

Exposing his students to such behind-the-scenes details is why Lundgren, a clinical assistant professor of music recording and technology, annually takes his Purdue University Fort Wayne students to Fort Wayne's largest venue. He wants them to get a full picture of what's expected during such a career—and after 18 years, Dennison is a pro at giving the 90-minute informational tours.

The City of Fort Wayne has announced that the Parnell Avenue Bridge located just north of St. Joe River Drive will be closed for "rehabilitation work" beginning Monday. It is not expected to reopen any earlier than Sept. 18. Drivers are advised to plan ahead and allow for potentially more time to get to the Coliseum.
