Day of Giving 2025 Finishes as One of the Best

Students at Purdue Fort Wayne received another outpouring of strong support during the university's annual Day of Giving on Wednesday. As the clock struck midnight, 1,240 gifts totaling \$793,854 had been registered. That's the second-highest number of gifts made during the seven years the annual fundraising initiative has taken place. The nearly \$800,000 raised is the third-highest total during that span.

The "Big Give" as it's called at PFW benefitted again from participants on and off campus including faculty, staff, alumni, and external supporters. Through gifts big and small, donors demonstrated their confidence in the university by investing in scholarships, academic programs, campus infrastructure, athletics, and other critical initiatives.

Today's Blood Drive Showcases Meyer's Passion to Help

As a middle school student, William Meyer was bullied because of his autism and other challenges, which could have forced him to isolate and bitterly turn inward. Instead, he says high school friends rescued him. Now as a Purdue University Fort Wayne senior, he finds ways to help others.

The human services major is spearheading a **Red Cross blood drive** today with the goal of making it the largest in PFW history. The available records say the most donors have been 40, a mark set a couple of years ago, but Meyer is encouraging at least 50 people to sign up or walk in.

The blood drive is taking place at Walb Student Union from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Registration is handled through the Red Cross website. Sponsors are the Division of Campus and Community Wellbeing, Campus Recreation, Student Life, Student Leadership, and the Student Activities Board.

Among several changes to streamline the ceremony this year, graduate students taking part in Purdue Fort Wayne's 2025 Commencement on May 14 have been invited to be hooded and photographed prior to the ceremony in the hallway just past the Appleseed Room at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum. This more intimate opportunity for family and friends to help celebrate the monumental achievement will take place between 1:30 and 3 p.m.

"We're constantly looking for ways to improve the ceremony and ease the significant time commitment for graduates, their families, and friends," said Jerry Lewis, vice chancellor for communications and marketing. "We want to be sure the ceremony ends at a reasonable time, so graduates can get to family dinners and other celebrations."

The act of hooding will be carried out in much the same way it always has with designated faculty hooders from each college or school standing by to do their part. To make sure everything flows smoothly, other assistants and volunteers will also be stationed at the Appleseed Room to lend a hand.

Graduate students will then wear their hoods throughout the commencement procession and degree conferral, rather than carrying them.

Faculty members involved in hooding are encouraged to stay for the 4 p.m. ceremony and walk and sit with faculty colleagues on the main arena floor.

Remember to leave plenty of time to pass through the metal detectors at security on the way into the Coliseum.
