Purdue Fort Wayne's 2025 Commencement a Moment to Reflect and Celebrate

Although it's happened 56 times before, commencement at Purdue University Fort Wayne has that wonderful knack of seeming like a brand-new exercise each and every spring. That's a testament to the hard work and achievements of students who understand that this may be their first time in the spotlight—but it probably won't be the last.

Purdue Fort Wayne's 57th commencement on Wednesday at Allen County War Memorial Coliseum will be a moment of reflection and celebration for nearly 800 students, along with their families and friends, who will join together to experience one of life's most significant milestones. As of Tuesday, 1,408 students are projected to earn their Purdue degree this academic year when the conferral process is completed in August.

Parnell Avenue Bridge Closure May Impact Route to Commencement

Anyone who might normally approach the Coliseum from the south via Parnell Avenue, including all those attending PFW's 2025 Commencement on Wednesday, needs to be aware of a closure and posted detours that could impact that specific route.

The City of Fort Wayne announced May 2 that the Parnell Avenue Bridge located just north of St. Joe River Drive will be closed for "rehabilitation work." It is not expected to reopen any earlier than Sept. 18. Drivers are advised to plan ahead and allow for potentially more time to get to the Coliseum.
