1. Classes Begin on Monday—the one four days from now!

- To avoid confusion, recheck your schedule and classroom location asap. Be aware, room assignments often change. You can review your schedule through goPFW.
- Arrive early to campus on your first day. This will allow you to get to where you
 need to be with plenty of time. If you'll be driving to campus, consider scoping
 out parking options well in advance, and be sure to park in the white spaces
 designated for students.

2. Connect with Your Advisor

Your academic advisor is an important resource. Reach out if you ever have
questions or concerns, especially if they are related to your courses. Drop-in
advising will be available during the first week of the term from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

3. Get Your Books

5. Check Your Email

- Now that you are a Mastodon, know that our official form of communication is via PFW emails. Be sure to check your inbox regularly so you don't miss out on special events, campus updates, and more. You can access your email through the Office 365 portal or by clicking the link on the main goPFW page.
- While we're on the topic of email, also remember to check out the *Don Life* student newsletter distributed on Wednesdays during the fall and spring semesters. Its regular weekly editions, and special editions distributed as needed, year-round, are often the first source for new information related to your student experience.

6. Know the Important Deadlines
