

Smart Plan Offers Students at Purdue Fort Wayne an AI-Powered View of Their Optimal Degree Pathways

For the first wave of students at Purdue University Fort Wayne who will get to use it, the Smart Plan degree platform should eliminate much of the guesswork often associated with choosing the classes needed to stay on track and on budget.

When the early registration window opens Oct. 27 for the spring and summer terms, students in 17 degree programs at PFW will gain access to this AI-powered tool that simplifies their experience by creating a personalized educational plan based on the chosen degree. Smart Plan will also notify them of changes or conflicts that may affect their path to a desired graduation date. More than 780 students will be able to take advantage of the new platform during the first phase of this multiyear implementation.

Sports Leadership Concentration Added for Athletic Academics

Since grade school, Kenton Aubrey admits he's always been a basketball junkie—playing, coaching, moving through various levels of positions at different colleges—and now teaching leadership in sports classes as an adjunct professor in the Department of Organizational Leadership at Purdue University Fort Wayne. As proof of his travels and experiences, Aubrey has collected more than 200 pairs of athletic shoes.

With this track record, Aubrey's students better be prepared to lace up their own shoes because they're going to be very busy as PFW continues to grow its recently launched sports leadership concentration. It's the natural progression from the class Aubrey has been teaching for three years, according to Michael Kirchner, chair of organizational leadership.

"We have a lot of student-athletes, athletics personnel, and general students expressing interest in these courses," Kirchner said. "We are definitely in a unique position in terms of how to center a curriculum that touches on all the different aspects of what it looks like to be successful in sports as a non-athlete."



Rove Shares Historical Context to Illustrate Nation's Resiliency

Perhaps many attending Tuesday evening's 30th season opener of Purdue University Fort Wayne's Omnibus Speaker Series expected Karl Rove to strongly critique the current White House occupant. Instead, the special advisor to President George W. Bush shredded the entire political system with a history lecture that did conclude with a glimmer of hope for the future. Perspective will help guide us forward, he taught.

After asking everyone in Auer Performance Hall to raise their hands if they were happy with the state of American politics, a rhetorical question that drew the intended laugh, Rove provided his perspective on past governmental eras when no one could seem to get along, suggesting the dysfunction has been even worse.

After reminding everyone of the turbulent and often violent events of the 1960s and early 1970s, Rove addressed the unrest of the 1800s through the election of 1904. Under his narration, it's a wonder the nation survived so much drama and constant arguing that seemed to never relent.

"If this gets bad today, it's been worse before, and we ought to take a little bit of solace from that, because it can get better," Rove said.
