#### Registration Open for Fifth Year of Adopt-a-Don Program

Santa is coming soon, and the chance to ask him for help is growing short. Purdue University Fort Wayne's Adopt-a-Don program to help students with families is evolving for the 2025 holiday season.

Entering its fifth year, the **Adopt-a-Don** program has raised more \$40,000 in donations to buy Christmas presents for students with families, including \$8,000 last year for 32 families. Along with food from the FRIENDS of the University Pantry, the gifts are bagged and handed out at the annual Jingle Jubilee dinner, which will be held Dec. 6 from 5 to 7 p.m. in the International Ballroom at Walb Student Union.

Students can **register to participate** before Oct. 24 and see the list of requirements. Those selected will be notified by Nov. 3. This year's event is expanding to include eligible Indiana University Fort Wayne Red Foxes.

There's also a place for those wishing to **donate to participate**, with suggested guidelines.
