These competitive merit-based scholarships—available to current high school seniors—offer full tuition, on-campus housing, textbooks, a stipend for food, and fees paid for up to four years.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Current high school senior set to complete Core 40 Diploma requirements or other college-prep curriculum
- 3.95 GPA, with 90th percentile class ranking; or 1380 SAT or higher; or 29 ACT or higher
- Submission of a completed application to Purdue Fort Wayne by January 6, 2026
- Completion of the Summit Scholarship online application by January 15, 2026
- Participation in the Virtual Summit Scholars Competition on February 21, 2026

RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS

- Be enrolled full-time during the fall and spring semesters
- · Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Meet program expectations
- · Reside in on-campus housing

SUMMIT SCHOLARSHIPS

THE SUMMIT SCHOLARS PROGRAM administers two full-ride scholarships: the Chapman Scholarship and the Doermer Distinguished Scholarship. Both awards offer full tuition, on-campus housing, textbooks, a stipend for food, and fees paid for up to four years. Everyone who competes at the Summit Scholars Competition is eligible for the Chapman Scholarship. Depending on your major, you may be eligible to compete for the Doermer Distinguished Scholarship as well.

You'll also have the opportunity to be published in or sit on the executive, submission, and editorial boards of the *Summit City Journal: A Student Research Publication*— a peer-led and peer-reviewed journal developed by the Summit Scholars.

COMPETITION FAQ

CAN I COMPETE IN THE PURDUE FORT WAYNE VIRTUAL SUMMIT SCHOLARS COMPETITION?

Yes, if you're graduating from high school in 2026. To be eligible to participate in the competition, you must meet the academic requirements and submit a complete application for admission to Purdue Fort Wayne by **January 6.**

HOW DO I APPLY FOR THE PURDUE FORT WAYNE VIRTUAL SUMMIT SCHOLARS COMPETITION?

Once you apply to Purdue Fort Wayne and are deemed eligible to compete, you'll find a link to the application on your admissions checklist.

WHEN IS THE VIRTUAL COMPETITION?

The competition will be on Saturday, February 21, 2026.

WHAT WILL I BE DOING AT THE VIRTUAL COMPETITION?

You will take part in an interview, engage in one-on-one meetings with delegates from your declared major, and attend an information fair.

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR?

Business-casual or business-formal attire is recommended.

HOW WILL I BE NOTIFIED IF I'M SELECTED?

Once the competition results are finalized, the six Chapman Scholars and one Doermer Distinguished Scholar will be selected and offered scholarships. If you are offered a scholarship, you'll need to reply to the Summit Scholars Program by the deadline listed with your offer.
