WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST

CHASE BILLS (William Barfee/Leaf's Dad) is a junior pursuing a B.A. in Theatre with a concentration in directing. WHO'S WHO IN THE PRODUCTION STAFF

EMMALYN BROCKHAUS (Assistant Stage Manager) Emmalyn Brockhaus is a sophomore pursuing a B.F.A. in Musical Theatre. Typically a performer, this is her second crew position at PFW, as she was previously on wardrobe crew for *John Proctor is the Villain*. Her recent stage credits include Tribe in Three Rivers Music Theatre's *Hair*, Squirelle in Purdue Fort Wayne's *Elephant & Piggie's: "We Are in a Play!"*, and Cinderella in New Haven HS's *Into the Woods*.

LINDSEY FRANKLIN (Stage Manager) is pursuing a degree in Theatre and is in her junior year. She has been credited for stage managing the play *John Proctor is the Villian*, assistant stage managing *Urinetown*, *The Musical*, and *Cabaret*. Her previous stage credits include the Chorus in *Antigone Now* and Eulampia Petrovna and others in *Black Snow*. She looks forward to a professional career in stage management.

DR. MATTHEW GIALLONGO (Vocal Coach) has been praised for his "beautiful voice and singing with great depth of feeling." Equally at home on the operatic and concert stages, he has appeared with Opera Fort Collins, South Bend Lyric Opera, Indianapolis Opera, Actors Theatre of Indiana, and the Portsmouth Symphony Orchestra. Favorite roles include Papageno (*Die Zauberflöte*), Nardo (*La finta giardiniera*), Belcore (*L'elisir d'amore*), Silvio (*I pagliacci*), and Picasso in Tom Cipullo's *After Life*.

As a teacher and mentor, Dr. Giallongo has guided students to success in competitions, graduate schools, and summer programs across the country. His students have earned admission to institutions such as the University of Michigan, the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, and Indiana University, as well as young artist and training programs that prepare the next generation of professional singers.

Dr. Giallongo's scholarly work focuses on comparative vocal pedagogy, with an emphasis on French methods at the turn of the 20th century. He recently completed the first English translation of Jules Lefort's *Méthode de chant* and published an article in *Inter Nos*, the National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS) *Inter Nos* titled "Notes in Conflict: The Voice Teacher as Music Director." He is also a frequent presenter at conferences, with upcoming work including a presentation at the National NATS Conference in San Antonio.

He currently serves as Director of Vocal Studies at Purdue University Fort Wayne and has previously held faculty appointments at Eastern New Mexico University, Louisiana Tech University, Grambling State University, and Colorado State University–Pueblo.

Dr. Giallongo holds degrees from Gettysburg College (B.M. in Vocal Performance), Temple University (M.M. in Vocal Performance), and Colorado State University (M.M. in Vocal Pedagogy). He pursued postgraduate study

at the University of North Texas before earning his D.M.A. at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, where he studied with William McGraw.

EMMA HOUSER (Choreographer) is a senior pursuing a B.A. in Theatre. Stage credits include her performances in *The Love Talker, Elephant & Piggie's:* "We Are in a Play!", Hot 'n' Cole, The Tempest, and Urinetown. Houser was dance captain for Urinetown, Hot 'n' Cole, and choreographed for The Tempest, and Elephant & Piggie's: "We Are in a Play!". She has crewed for Peter and the Starcatcher, Little Women, and The Catastrophist. Houser studied dance for 13 years at Fort Wayne School of Dance.

HOLLY KNOTT (Music Director) has been the instrumental music director at Purdue Fort Wayne for more than twenty years, working on such shows as Cabaret, Urinetown, Little Women: the Musical, Sondheim on Sondheim, The World According to Snoopy, On the 20th Century, How to Succeed..., A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Oliver!, Into the Woods, and Little Shop of Horrors. She has served as music director for Fort Wayne Civic Theatre's productions of I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change, The Rocky Horror Show, White Christmas, and Waitress. She has played piano and keyboard in local theaters for more than 30 years at venues including Arena Dinner Theatre, Grey Lite Theatre, and several area high schools. During the day, she accompanies the Leo High School choir.

COREY E. LEE (Lighting Designer) is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Theatre for the department and a graduate of Purdue Fort Wayne. Lee holds an M.F.A. in theatre design and production (University of Memphis), a B.A. in theatre, and a B.S. in secondary education with an emphasis in earth/space science (PFW). Before returning to Purdue University Fort Wayne, he served as the Visiting Assistant Teaching Professor in Lighting Design for the Department of Theatre and Dance at Ball State University, where his designs included Gloria, Kinky Boots, and Groove: Interlocking Cultures Through Movement. Lee was previously the lighting designer and technical director at the Fort Wayne Civic Theatre. His designs include Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street, Jekyll and Hyde, Matilda, Rock of Ages, The Rocky Horror Show, Disney Newsies, Avenue Q, and Memphis. Previous lighting design credits also include Sondheim on Sondheim, The Glass Menagerie, Into the Woods, The Laramie Project (PFW), Peter and the Starcatcher (Arena Dinner Theatre), Holiday Pops (Fort Wayne Philharmonic) and, Seussical (University of Saint Francis). Corey has also worked with Huntington University, Mikautadze Dance Theatre, Fort Wayne Youtheatre, Embassy Theatre, Manchester University, Fort Wayne Ballet, Fort Wayne Summer Music Theatre, Summit City Music Theatre, Three Rivers Music Theatre, Fort Wayne Dance Collective, and Northrop High School.



JEANNE PENDLETON (Costume Supervisor) graduated with distinction in 2002 from Humboldt State University in Arcata, California, with an M.F.A. in costume design. After receiving her degree, she moved to Pigeon Forge, Tennessee, to costume shows for Dollywood, as well as create garments for the namesake of the park, Dolly Parton. Prior to her arrival at Purdue Fort Wayne, Pendleton worked at the LORT D Clarence Brown Theatre in residence at the University of Tennessee–Knoxville. While there, she supervised the construction of costumes for many professional and regionally known designers. As an active freelance costume designer, she regularly collaborates with Mikautadze Dance Theatre as well as several other area theatre companies.

AUSTIN M. RAUSCH (Costume Designer) is an Assistant Professor of Theatre – Costume Design at Purdue University Fort Wayne. He holds an M.F.A. in Costume Design from The Pennsylvania State University and a B.A. from St. Edward's University in Austin, TX. Notable PFW design credits include The Love Talker, Cabaret, The Tempest, Urinetown, and Little Women: The Musical. Professionally, he has designed for Bigfork Summer Playhouse (Something Rotten!, Footloose, The Addams Family) and Purdue University West Lafayette (Dead Man's Cell Phone). Austin's pedagogical research explores fear and creativity, with presentations at national conferences and a publication in the International Journal for Education and the Arts titled "Fear and How It Inhibits Creativity." He also recently co-presented "Bridging Creativity and Connection: UDL-Driven Gamification for Powerful Analysis" at the 2025 CELT Fall Teaching Conference. In addition to design and pedagogy, Austin directed Black Snow at PFW in April 2023.

BEV REDMAN (Director) is the chair of the Purdue University Fort Wayne Department of Theatre and former chair of the Theatre and Dance Department at Ursinus College in the Philadelphia region. She also held faculty positions at Loyola Marymount University, Los Angeles, and the University of Texas at El Paso, where she served as director of graduate studies in theatre. Redman holds an M.A. in English from Georgetown University, an M.F.A. in theatre directing from the University of California, Irvine, and a Ph.D. in theatre history, dramatic literature and performance studies from the joint-campus program of the Universities of California, Irvine and San Diego campuses. She is also a certified teacher of Fitzmaurice Voicework©.

ROBERT SHOQUIST (Scenic Designer/Technical Director/Production Coordinator) holds an M.F.A. in stage design (Northwestern University) and a B.A. in directing and design (Boise State University). At Purdue University Fort Wayne, Shoquist teaches stagecraft, introduction to stage management and theatre production I and II. His scenic designs include *The Love Talker*, Elephant & Piggie's: "We Are In A Play!", Cabaret, Hot 'n' Cole: A Cole Porter Celebration!, The Bald Soprano, Little Women: the Musical, Peter and the Starcatcher, Sondheim on Sondheim, The Laramie Project, Grease, Ghetto, A Year with Frog and Toad, Once Upon a Mattress, Romeo and Juliet, Pride & Prejudice, Little Shop of Horrors, Blithe Spirit, and Stupid F*@%ing Bird. Regional and local credits include Ghost Girl (Workshop Theatre, NYC); Marry Me A Little (Harbor Lights Theater, NYC); The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee. Nunsense, The Honky Tonk Angels (West Virginia Public Theatre); My Fair Lady, Anything Goes and Dirty Rotten Scoundrels (Allenberry Playhouse, Penn.); and Shrek the Musical, Les Misérables, A Few Good Men, Cabaret, and Spamalot (FW Civic Theatre).

BAILEY WEAVER (Assistant Stage Manager) is a junior at PFW pursuing a Theatre B.A. in acting. He was last seen on our stage as Jon in *TAPE*, Classroom Student in *John Proctor is the Villain*, and Likospastov in *Black Snow*. Previous stage credits come from his tenure at Elkhart HS. Bailey performed the roles of Sergei in *Matilda: The Musical*, Gilbert Blythe in *Anne of Green Gables*, and Odysseus in *The Iliad, The Odyssey, and All of Greek Mythology*.

AUTHOR BIOGRAPHIES

WILLIAM FINN (Music and Lyrics) Mr. Finn was the writer and composer of Falsettos, for which he received two Tony Awards, Best Book of a Musical (with James Lapine) and Best Original Score. He also wrote and composed In Trousers, March of the Falsettos and Falsettoland (Outer Critics Circle Award for Best Musical, two Los Angeles Drama Critic's Awards, two Drama Desk Awards, the Lucille Lortel Award, and Guggenheim Fellowship in Musical Composition). Finn wrote the lyrics to Graciela Daniele's Tango Apasionado (music by the great Astor Piazzolla) and, with Michael Starobin, the music to Lapine's version of The Winter's Tale. His musical, Romance in Hard Times, was presented at the Public Theater. He wrote *Painting You for Love's Fire*, a piece commissioned and performed bye the Acting Company, based on Shakepeare's sonnets. For television, Finn provided the music and lyrics for the Ace Award-winning HBO cartoon "Ira Sleeps Over," "Tom Thumb and Thumbelina," "Pokey Little Puppy's First Christmas," and, with Ellen Fitzhugh, two "Brave Little Toaster" cartoons. Finn wrote for Vogue, Harper's Bazaar, and The New Yorker. A graduate of Williams College where he was awarded the Hutchinson Fellowship for Musical Composition, Finn taught a weekly master class at the NYU Tisch Graduate Program in Musical Theatre Writing. Other projects include Elegies, A Song Cycle (Lincoln Center) and The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee which ran on Broadway and has been produced nationally and internationally, as well.

RACHEL SHEINKIN (Book) Broadway: The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee (Tony, Drama Desk Awards); Off Broadway: Striking 12 (Lucille Lortel nomination), Off-Off: Serenade. Regional: Guthrie, Little House on the Prairie; Center Theater Group, Sleeping Beauty Wakes (Los Angeles Ovation Award); London: Blood Drive. Residencies, fellowships, commissions include: Eugene O'Neill National Theater Center, Baryshnikov Dance Foundation, MacDowell Colony, Manhattan Theatre Club, Deaf West, McCarter Theatre, Playwrights Horizons. Sheinkin is a volunteer mentor for TDF's Open Doors program, a visiting instructor at Yale School of Drama, and adjunct faculty member of NYU's Graduate Musical Theater Writing Program.

REBECCA FELDMAN (Conceiver) Rebecca Feldman is the conceiver of *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* for which she won a Lucille Lortel Award, Drama Desk Award, and Tony Nomination for Best Musical. She directed its world premiere at Barrington Stage Company in the summer of 2004.

Feldman is an associate producer on *Transparent, The Musical Finale* and served as a staff writer on the finale as well. She is currently developing an episodic drama with Big Kid Pictures, called *La Coyote*, which has been selected to the WeForShe's 2019 Writeher List.

She is an alumna of the Lincoln Center Director's Lab as well as the AFI Directing Workshop for Women where she won the Jean Firstenburg Award for Best Short.

Her short films include, *My First Time Driving* (AFI Jean Firstenburg Award, Best Short at Lake Arrowhead Film Fest, Best of Shorts at Outfest), *A/V Club* (TV Pilot, NYTVF), *Uber Alice* (Woodstock Film Fest), *Dead Cat* (Producer, Tribeca Film Fest) and *Irving* (Official Selection Rhode Island Film Fest, Official Selection USA Film Fest, Ft. Lauderdale Film Fest, Atlanta Jewish Film Fest).

JAY REISS (Additional Materials) is a playwright. He is a Julliard graduate and provided additional material to the book for *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee.* Reiss appeared in the original workshops, Off-Broadway cast, and Broadway cast of the musical as Vice Principal Douglas Panch.

THE FARM was founded in 2000 by Rebecca Feldman, Artistic Director. It is a collective of writers and performers, including Jay Reiss, Dan Fogler, and Sarah Saltzberg. The Farm's interest is in the role of improvisation in creating new work for the theatre. The Farm initially designates a two-week intensive period in which to discover, develop, and rehearse a play from the impulses borne mainly out of the pressure of a deadline. Previous projects include *Super* (at Atlantic Theatre Studios), *Why I Hate Florida* (workshop at White Wave in DUMBO) and *C-R-E-P-U-S-C-U-L-E* (at the Present Company Theatorium in October 2002), on which *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* is based. The character and original dialogue of "Beth Marguiles," "Vice President Douglas Panch," "Mr. Barfee," and "Logan Schwarzengrubenierre" were created by Rebecca Feldman, Jay Reiss, Dan Fogler, and Sarah Saltzberg, respectively.






